Film Oscar Nominee.

ATANARJUAT, THE FAST RUNNER* – Canada, 2001 (172 min.)
Dir.: Zacharias Kunuk. With: Natar Ungalaaq, Sylvia Ivalu, Peter Henry
Arnatsiaq. First ever Inuktitut-language feature, based on an ancient Inuit
legend about power, jealousy and treachery; filmed on Baffin Island.
Camera d'Or winner at Cannes as well as the Genie for Best Picture.

With: Nanni Moretti, Laura Morante, Jasmine Trinca. Drama about the
impact of the tragic loss of a child on a normal middle-class family. Palme
d'Or winner at Cannes.
